Angela Brady (keynote speaker)

Angela Brady was born in Dublin and graduated from the Dublin School of Architecture. She set up in private practice with Robin Mallalieu forming Brady Mallalieu Architects 20 years ago, an award winning design led practice specialising in contemporary sustainable design. BMA's work appears regularly in the architectural and national press and in exhibitions in the UK and Europe eg: "Sustainable London" and "Des Res" exhibitions at the NLA Building Centre London.

Angela's new 7 part Channel 4 TV series The Home Show is about design in European Cities. She has appeared both in the national and professional press and on television and radio on the subject of architecture and the built environment. She filmed a tour of Dublin's new architecture for the RTE arts TV 'Blackbox' and appeared regularly as an architectural advisor on Channel 5's TV series 'Hot Property'; on talk shows on Radio 4 'You and Yours'; BBC 3 Night Hawks and BBC 1 London Tonight. RTE Radio 1 Tubrity show and a documentary on Teacher TV - in Nov 2007. BMA give many lectures on their work. Angela appeared as designer and co presenter of the "Building the Dream" series on ITV 1 (also on Ulster TV and Canadian TV) - a 65 part series on building a house in a reality TV setting. The house was built in 14 weeks and was aired 3 times daily from March to July 2004. It promoted sustainable contemporary architecture by example.

Brady Mallalieu Architects have won many Design Awards. Current projects include several housing and health care projects for the private and public sectors. Angela won an Irish Post/ AIB Bank highlighting personal achievement in architecture. She was made a fellow of the RIAI and is an elected member of the RIAI Architects Council. She was made an honorary fellow of the RSA (Royal Society of Arts). She is also invited to speak as a regular debater" on architectural panels on BBC Radio Such as the RIBA debates annually. She designs workshops for children and adults for Dublin Open House 2008 - also appeared on RTE TV news Chairperson of Women In Architecture at RIBA (2000-2005) Angela has given public presentations in 16 major cities around the world since 2004 - 2008 with the Diversecity exhibition - promoting diversity and women in architecture, Cities include London, Beijing, Luxembourg, Brussels, Los Angeles, Sydney, Auckland, Istanbul, Dublin, Cardiff, Athens and Paris www.diversecity-architects.com.

Angela Brady was finalist in the AJ/Atkins "Women of Outstanding Achievement" awards 2007.

DiverseCity

Background to the exhibition shown at ZIMT 09

The exhibition is designed to celebrate the diversity of architects in the host locality. It will showcase the range and quality of designs and completed projects by a selection of women, minority or under-represented but qualified professionals who are active in the domain of architecture. The exhibition began with the London DiverseCity exhibition which opened at RIBA in September 2003 with a preview in Luxembourg that same month. It was compiled by Architects for Change, the equality forum of the RIBA.

As the Exhibition moves from place to place it will acquire additional panels from each place. This growing exhibition is called “The Global Snowball of DiverseCity.” It has traveled to a number of cities around the globe i.e. Sydney, Beijing, Chicago, New York, Dublin, to 6 venues in the UK and now to Linz.

The exhibition is divided into two sections. ‘Qualified Architects and Designers’ and ‘Movers and Shakers’. The latter covers organisations, committees, support groups and some individuals who actively promote diversity ensuring that the profession becomes as inclusive as possible. The exhibition panels are designed to educate and encourage others who are either entering into the architectural profession or already in it. The panels have a particularly powerful message for women and minorities. Central to the content of the exhibition is the contribution of women and ethnic minority architects. Their personal statements and reflections on architecture allow us to hear voices rarely heard, comprehend new experiences, and be presented with alternative perspectives on architecture. The overarching aim of DiverseCity is to sensitise the viewer to the issues surrounding the lack of diversity in architecture - a complex and deepseated problem. The exhibition is offered as an inspirational and informative introduction to groups and individuals who are calling for the transformation of architecture into a modern profession that truly embraces diversity.

“The DiverseCity exhibition celebrates diversity of people in architecture . It has travelled to major cities around the world spreading the word on diversity in our profession and collecting a parallel exhibition from each country. This exhibition shows a selection of people and projects who have taken part in this Global Snowball celebrating ethnicity and gender”.
